

Principal's Sharing

Dear Parents and Students,

In order to fulfill the requirements of the Education Bureau, I have visited 4 secondary schools, including Kwun Tong Kung Lok Government Secondary School, G.T. College (Primary Section), Our Lady's College and Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial College. It has been such an eye-opening experience that every school has their own strength for us to learn. For example, G.T. College has organized an Elite Student Team to commend students with excellent performance in academic study, extra-curricular activities and conduct, while the library of Our Lady's College has their own publishing.

For the sake of developing closer relationship with other schools, I was invited to be the guest of honor of the graduation ceremony of P.L.K. Madam Chan Wai Chow Memorial School, attended an Visual Arts exhibition of P.L.K. Lam Man Chan English Primary School in April, gave a speech at Rosaryhill School in May, adjudicated during a graduation feast of C.C.C. Kung Lee College, etc. Apart from strengthening the network with other schools, I also updated them the latest development of our school.

Our outstanding students were interviewed by a reporter from 'Elite School Guide' of East Week Magazine on 5th March. The reporter was so interested in the education and inheritance of Chinese traditions as this is our uniqueness. A 3-paged featured story of our school was published on 23rd April.

Professor Li Kam Keung from Baptist University gave a talk on Xinhai Revolution to our students on 15th March. After the talk, the audience shared their opinions about revolution and the audience from other schools also asked a lot of questions which made an eye-opening scene to our students.

The Hong Kong Rugby Football Union (HKRFU) invited our school's Supervisor and I to join a luncheon of Hong Kong Police Inspectors' Club with some rugby celebrities and Olympic champions on 27th March. The Hong Kong Sevens were held from 28th to 30th March and 50 tickets were offered to our students. The HKRFU also rented our classrooms and playground to help to organize the event. Our students even participated in some of the activities of the event such as the Official Ballot. Feeding Hong Kong held a charity lunch, with the Under-Secretary of Environment Bureau Christine Loh Kung Wai being the guest of honour at our school on 28th March. 50 guests with different nationalities enjoyed the lunch cooked by

5-star chefs and service of our student volunteers. Loh even sent us a thank you letter for involving her in such a meaningful event afterwards.

More than 100 alumni organized a barbecue on 6th April. Even though it was a bit rainy that day, the rain did not stop the passion of our alumni. Some alumni suggested that the graduation cohort should also be invited in order to strengthen the relationship among the alumni.

An excursion to visit the Enshi Tujia in Hubei which is a closing activity of the 60th Anniversary celebration was held from 4th to 8th May. More than 15 students were subsidized by Dr. Tsui Ping Kwong, who is one of the members of the School Board to join this activity. The Supervisor, Ms. Ho Chung Wing, who is the Chairperson of the PTA and I were also invited to symbolize the 'family spirit'. The activity was highly supported by the local officials of the destination. Mr. Zhang Gang from the Center for Ethnic and Folk Literature and Art development, Ministry of Culture, P.R.C. and Ms. Wang Jing from the Integrated Services Department accompanied our students almost every day. Our students have learnt a lot through visiting the ethnic minorities in person and learning dancing from the local ethnic minorities there. The local officials highly commended our students as they were highly engaged and learned with a very serious attitude. All students agreed that the activity had broadened their horizons and had been a very memorable experience. I stood at a summit and told that students to always aim high and have an open mind.

Our students' talent has been recognized again in inter-school competitions. We are the district champion of the Hong Kong Schools' Classic Poetry Recitation Competition. Also, we won prizes in a slogan and writing competition organized by the Rotary Club. I hereby wish our students resilience and success.
